ABSTRACT SUBMISSION FOR POSTERS & HOT TOPIC TALKS. A limited number of posters and hot topic talks will be selected from submitted abstracts. If you have a new development or research pertaining to the meeting topic that you wish to present, please submit an abstract by the **August 29** deadline. Submission details at www.asms.org/conferences/asilomar-conference/abstract-submission.

Please note that abstracts are **not** required for invited talks and abstracts are not published (for invited talks, hot topic talks, or posters). Submitted abstracts are used only for evaluation and selection of relevant posters and hot topic talks. The spirit of the ASMS Asilomar Conference is to encourage discussion about the latest (unpublished) research in a topic area.

LOCATION. The conference and accommodations are at the Asilomar Conference Grounds, 800 Asilomar Avenue, Pacific Grove, California 93950. The campus-style setting of Asilomar offers an ideal environment for informal meetings and recreational activities. Asilomar, “the refuge by the sea,” is located at the tip of the Monterey Peninsula overlooking the Pacific Ocean. It occupies 105 acres of secluded forest and dunes that are preserved by the California State Park System as a nature center and historic site.

LODGING AT ASILOMAR. Hotel accommodations are available at Asilomar Conference Grounds. Rooms are charming and comfortable and have in-room WiFi internet access, but do not have televisions or telephones.

Room rates include three meals per day (beginning with dinner on arrival day and ending with lunch on departure day) as well as all taxes.

- **Single Occupancy (one person, one room).** Rate includes three meals per day and ALL taxes
\$277.08 per night (\$1,108.32 for the full conference)
- **Roommate Request - Double Occupancy*** (shared room with two beds). Rate includes three meals per day and ALL taxes.
\$184.71 per night, per person (\$738.84 per person for the full conference)
- **Participant Plus Guest - Double Occupancy** (shared room with one king bed). Rate includes three meals per day and ALL taxes
\$369.42 per night, per couple (\$1,477.68 per couple for the full conference)

OFFSITE PARTICIPANTS. All conference attendees who opt to stay offsite and not reserve a guest room at Asilomar will need to pay a \$200 offsite fee. This fee must be paid through online conference registration or the printable registration form in this brochure. The fee covers a usage fee assessed by the facility as well as lunch tickets for Saturday, Sunday, and Monday.

PARTICIPANT GUESTS. If you are bringing a guest to the conference (not attending technical sessions) you may arrange and pay for your guest to share a room with you at Asilomar (see Participant Plus Guest – Double Occupancy room option above). Guests are also welcome to attend the Monday evening banquet dinner with ticket purchase: \$20 (if lodging at Asilomar) or \$30 (if staying offsite).

MONDAY NIGHT BANQUET. A special dinner is planned for Monday. Advanced ticket purchase is required. Cost is \$20 for participants staying at Asilomar and \$30 for participants staying offsite.

AIR TRAVEL – GETTING TO ASILOMAR. Asilomar is approximately 120 miles from San Francisco International Airport (SFO) and 65 miles from San Jose International Airport (SJC). From these airports to Asilomar you may choose to rent a car or take the Monterey Airbus shuttle. Asilomar Conference Center is listed under ‘Hotel’ on the Monterey Airbus website as a drop-off/pick-up location. From SFO to Asilomar the fee is \$65 one-way and from SJC the fee is \$55 one-way. Save \$5 per trip if you book online at www.montereyairbus.com. You may also fly into the Monterey Regional Airport (MRY). Taxi fare from Monterey Airport to Asilomar is approximately \$30.

STUDENT AND POST-DOC TRAVEL STIPENDS

Twenty Stipends of up to \$750 each available to graduate students or post-docs within two years of first appointment. Stipend recipients will also receive complimentary registration. **Deadline is August 7.**
